## Free School Meals

Pupil Premium is given to school by the government to further support eligible pupils. If you apply now and it's approved, then it's in place for all 7 years of primary school and you won't be landed with surprise dinner bills by the time they hit Key Stage Two. You can also get support for Residential Trips in Years 5 and 6. Although this may seem a long time from now for some of you, your child and the school will benefit from applying as soon as possible. If you receive: - Universal credit- Income support- Income based job seekers allowance- Income-related employment and support allowance-Child tax credit- Working tax credit run onpaid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Please could you click on the link below and complete the "Free School Meal - FSM" check. It takes 5-10 minutes and it makes a huge difference to us and your child.

If you want to apply but cannot access this link, please speak to the school office and we can assist with your application within school.

If you are eligible, please let us know so we can update our records.

If people need help with applications, please come and see the office team.


